

Contributors without SSNs

- Federal Student Aid (FSA) has said that contributors without an SSN should be able to complete the process (available since early March)
- Contributors who do not pass the TransUnion knowledge-based match will be assigned a case number and emailed instructions on the next steps to provide documentation for the identity match
- Contributors may continue with the FAFSA process while their identity is unmatched
- Schools will request paperwork and verify identities before releasing funds

FAFSA Status

For the 2024–25 FAFSA® form, the status of your application will be one of the following:






Draft: Your section of the FAFSA form is incomplete.



In Progress: You provided your consent, approval, and signature to your section of the FAFSA form, but it has not been submitted yet.




In Review: Your FAFSA form was submitted but hasn't been processed yet.




Action Required

Action Required: You are missing your consent and approval or signature, or the FAFSA form was processed, but a correction is required.



Processed: Your application was processed successfully. No further action is needed.



Closed: Your FAFSA form was never submitted and can no longer be submitted because the federal FAFSA deadline passed.

FAFSA Corrections

- Students whose FAFSA has been processed are now able to make corrections to their FAFSA
 - Colleges are not yet able to make corrections on their end on behalf of the student.
- Student may make corrections in their FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) online, on paper, or by contacting Federal Student Aid. <u>Online processing is highly recommended.</u>
- Regardless of original application method, students can access their FSS and submit corrections online if they create a studentaid.gov account.
- Give colleges <u>at least</u> 2 weeks after the FSS is received before expecting a financial aid offer.

- Go to My Activity
- Select FAFSA Submission
- Select Start Your Correction


The student should access their FAFSA Submission Summary to see what errors need to be addressed on the FAFSA form. The student can access their FAFSA Submission Summary by selecting the "Actions" button or scrolling to the "FAFSA Submission History" section and selecting "View FAFSA Submission Summary" in the "Actions" column.



Your application is incomplete.

You indicated you wanted to apply for only an unsubsidized loan because your parents are unwilling to provide their information. This means you are not eligible for other types of federal student aid.


If this is a mistake, select "Start Your Correction" and change your answer to the question on the Dependency Status page to "No" so that you can invite your parent(s) to your FAFSA form. Otherwise, contact your financial aid office.



Corrections: Navigating To Section


- Choose Continue
- If there are known errors that need corrections they will be displayed
- You will be brought to the beginning of the section for known errors
- If there are no known errors, you will have to navigate through the form to the section you need to correct






Corrections: Providing Signature

- Log into studentaid.gov
- Go to My Activity
- Select FAFSA Submission
- Choose Provide Signature
- Choose Provide Signature again
- If signature is the only correction needed you'll be taken directly to that page
- If other corrections are needed you'll be taken to the first page needing corrections



Corrections: Providing Signature


- Choose Sign and Submit
- You'll see the confirmation page that confirms the signature has been submitted



Corrections: Unsub Only Change

- Log into studentaid.gov
- Go to My Activity
- Select FAFSA Submission
- Select Start Your Corrections
- Select Continue




Corrections: Unsub Only Change


- Navigate through the Personal
 Circumstances section until you reach
 Your Dependency Status
- Change the answer of the question from Yes to No
- Select Continue
- Navigate through the rest of the form until you reach the *Invite Contributors* Section

Your Dependency Status Dependent Student Based on your answers, you are a dependent student. This means you must provide parent information on your FAFSA® form. This information helps determine how much federal student aid you're eligible to receive. **Direct Unsubsidized Loan Only** Are the student's parents unwilling to provide their information, but the student doesn't have an unusual circumstance that prevents them from contacting or obtaining their parents' information? (1) Select "No" if the student wants a financial aid administrator at their school to determine eligibility for ALL types of financial aid, including grants, loans, and work-study funds. The student's parent(s) will be required to provide their information on the FAFSA form. ○ No Yes Previous

Corrections: Unsub Only Change

- Invite Contributor(s) (parent(s))
- Review changes and press
 Continue
- You will receive a notice that contributor information is still needed
- Have contributor(s) log in and follow the instructions to complete their sections





Corrections: Known Issues

- 2024–25 FAFSA Issue Alerts | Knowledge Center
- Student assets are incorrectly removed when completing a correction
 - Issue is now resolved as of 4/14
- Applicant encounters an error when starting a correction and cannot view the FAFSA form
 - Issue is now resolved as of 4/25
- Some users who manually entered tax information cannot submit a correction
 - Issue is now resolved as of 4/25
- Not on the official list but we have heard some students are having difficulty when trying to correct their HS diploma information

School Deadlines

- New! Massachusetts extended the FAFSA priority deadline from May 1st to July 1st, 2024 for the MASSGrant program
- Some schools are extending financial aid and enrollment deadlines because of the delays
- Most schools who have not extended deadlines have expressed that they will be flexible with students unable to meet deadlines due to FAFSA delays
- Students should take screenshots of any errors they encounter to share with colleges
- Patience is encouraged. Colleges are trying to process what normally would be 6 months of FAFSA submissions in a severely condensed timeline.
- Keep an eye on emails from colleges to student and parents with important updates.






