

About MEFA



About the FAFSA

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- FREE form (NEVER pay to submit the FAFSA): <u>fafsa.gov</u>
- Required by all colleges/universities for federal & state (& some institutional) aid
- Opens October 1st
- Complete and submit ASAP and before the earliest college deadline (!!)
 - Early Action/Decision: Usually a fall deadline
 - Regular Decision: Usually a Feb or March deadline
- Complete online, but can find a full FAFSA PDF online
- Online skip logic removes questions not applicable to individual students/parents
- Must be completed each year (one for every child)
- Tip: If an answer is zero or the question does not apply, students/families should enter 0
- Application may ask you to check for errors on a question. Type the answer again
- Note: students/families may have other financial aid applications required

myStudentAid Mobile App

- Complete the FAFSA
- View the Student Aid Report (SAR)
- Can switch between mobile and desktop
- Both student and parent need to log in
 - Enter FSA ID to begin



Items & Info Needed to Complete the FAFSA

- Student driver's license (not required)
- Student and parent(s)
 - Social Security number
 - Date of birth
 - 2020 W-2 form(s) (or pay stub)
 - 2020 federal income tax return (if not using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool)
 - 2020 untaxed income records
 - Current bank statements
 - Current business and investment records

FAFSA® Deadlines Many states and colleges set priority deadlines by which you must submit the FAFSA form to be considered for the aid programs they administer. There is also a federal deadline each academic year. Select your state of legal residence and the school year for which you're applying for federal student aid. 


Use personal identifiers (name, DOB, SSN)

- The parent will also need an FSA ID









What Students are Eligible for Federal Financial Aid?

- U.S. citizens
- Eligible non-citizens, including:
 - U.S. Nationals
 - Permanent Residents
 - Carriers of Arrival-Departure Records (I-94)
 - Holders (student or parent) of a T-visa
 - "Battered immigrant-qualified aliens"
 - Citizens of the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, or the Republic of Palau.
- Citizenship status will be verified by:
 - the Social Security Administration (citizens)
 - the Department of Homeland Security (eligible non-citizens)




Further Eligibility Details

- Current high school students should select:
 - Working on 1st bachelor's degree
 - Will <u>not</u> have 1st bachelor's degree before 2022-23
- Interested in work-study? Answering yes does <u>not</u>:
 - Obligate the student to work
 - Guarantee a job
 - Cause the student to lose grants and scholarships
- Males (males at birth) 18 and older must register for Selective Service; the answer to this question will <u>not</u> impact the applicant's eligibility to receive federal student aid




Student Driver's License




Driver's license information is not required

High School Information




If high school diploma is selected, the student will have to list a high school

- Check the box to select a school





Dependency Determination


Questions on:

- Marital status
- Pursuit of a graduate degree
- Birthdate
- Dependents who receive your support
- Active duty military or veteran
- If since turned 13: orphan, foster care, ward of the court
- Emancipated minor
- In legal guardianship
- Homeless

Independent students do not have to report parent data





Parent Marital Status Selection




Who is Considered a Parent?



- Biological or adoptive parent(s), and certain step-parents
- Include both parents if parents are married or are not married but live together
- Married parents include same-sex couples
- If separated but living together, select "Married"
- In the case of divorce or separation, provide information only about the parent the student lived with more in the last 12 months, and step-parent if that parent is remarried

Parent Demographics Information



Who's Included in the Household Size?

- Student
- Parent(s)
- Parents' other children (even if don't live with parents), if parents will provide more than half of their financial support from 7/1/22 through 6/30/23 or the children are federally dependent
- Other people who live with the parents, parents provide more than half of their financial support, and parents will continue to provide more than half their support from 7/1/22 through 6/30/23




Who's Included in the Number in College?



- Always include the student, even if he/she will attend college less than half time in 2022-23
- Include other household members only if they will attend at least half time in 2022-23 in a program that leads to a college degree or certificate
- Do not include the parents
- Some financial aid offices will require proof that other family members are attending college.

Parent Tax Return Information

- Provide information from your 2020 federal tax return
 - Completion status
 - Type of return
 - Filing status
- Option to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT)



Will be asked to supply parent's FSA ID to access IRS DRT

IRS Data Retrieval Tool

- Upload 2020 federal tax return data directly to the FAFSA
- Will not be able to view on screen your transferred information
- Will be asked if you had a rollover (and amount) if untaxed IRS distributions or untaxed pensions/annuities are present
- Those married filing jointly will need to input income earned from working
- Certain individuals cannot use the tool:
 - Married individuals who file married filing separately or head of household
 - Parents with the marital status of "Unmarried and both legal parents living together"
 - Any student or parent who filed a Puerto Rican tax return, foreign tax return, or an IRS Form 1040-NR

Info to Enter If IRS DRT Not Used



- Adjusted Gross Income
- Amount earned from working
- Income tax from tax return
- Other income from tax return

Questions from tax return will notate tax return line numbers

Items Subtracted From Total Income on the FAFSA

- Child support paid
- Earnings from a co-op
- Taxable earnings from work-study or fellowships/assistantships
- Combat pay
- Student grants/scholarships reported to the IRS in parent income
- Education credits such as the AOTC




Untaxed Income

- Payments to tax-deferred pension and retirement savings plans
- IRA deductions to SEP, SIMPLE, Keogh, & other qualified plans
- Child support received
- Tax-exempt interest income
- Untaxed portions of IRS distributions
- Untaxed portions of pensions
- Housing & living allowances paid to military, clergy, and others
- Veterans non-education benefits (disability, death pension, or DIC)
- Other untaxed income such as workers compensation and disability





Reporting Assets




Parent Assets To Be Reported

- <u>Current balance</u> of cash, savings, and checking accounts
- Net value of investments
 - Real estate
 - Rental properties
 - Money market and mutual funds
 - Stocks & bonds
 - 529 college savings for <u>all</u> children (reported as a parent asset)
- Net value of some businesses and investment farms

Do not include your primary residence, life insurance, value of retirement accounts, and value of small family businesses or farms




Student Information




- Student will be asked same income and asset questions as parents
- Student should report all 2020 income even if he/she did not file taxes
- Student will be offered option to use IRS DRT if he/she filed taxes

Here's what happens next:

- · You will receive an email version of this page.
- In 3–5 business days, you will receive an email notifying you that your FAFSA form was processed.
- Your FAFSA information will be made available to your school(s), and they will use it to determine the aid you may be eligible to receive.
- Your school(s) will contact you if they need more information or when they are ready to discuss your financial aid award.
- If you have questions about your financial aid package, contact your school(s).

Do you have another child who needs to complete a FAFSA?

If so, you can transfer your information into a new FAFSA form for your other child to save time. You will have to provide a signature again, but that's all.

Special Circumstances

Contact the Financial Aid Office if there are circumstances which affect your ability to pay for college such as:

- Loss or reduction in parent/student income or assets
- Death or serious illness
- Natural disasters affecting parent income or assets
- Medical or dental expenses not covered by insurance
- Financial responsibility for elderly grandparents



What Happens After You Submit the FAFSA



- Colleges and the state receive the data electronically
- Students will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR) (electronically or by mail) in a few days
- Colleges may request additional documentation or information, such as tax data, through a process called Verification
- Colleges send out financial aid offers (typically Mar-April)


