Coming to MASSAid: College Cost & Financial Aid Eligibility Information





What's new in MASSAid

The MASSAid Portal lets students and families access and track college financial aid information upon completing the FAFSA

In the past...

- Students must visit the website for each college they are interested in attending to locate and see the cost of attendance, making it difficult to easily compare costs across instructions.
- Students must visit the websites for each state aid program to see if they are potentially eligible for aid, and provide the same information multiple times, even if the state has this information.
- Contact information for college financial aid offices can be hard to locate on the institution's website.

With this enhancement to MASSAid...

- Students can view and compare the cost of attendance for any Massachusetts institution of higher education, public or private, and compare costs for up to 4 colleges at once.
- Students can see their potential eligibility for up to 12 state and federal aid programs based on information from the FAFSA and state records, providing a starting point for learning more about the eligibility process.
- Students visit a single page on the OSFA website listing contact information for all Massachusetts college financial aid offices.


How it Works

MASSAid uses information from the FAFSA to display college costs and calculate financial aid eligibility information for each student.



Welcome Banner


First-time college applicants who submit a FAFSA will see a banner highlighting the information they can find on the new page.






Estimated Cost of Attendance


The top section automatically populates with the first four Massachusetts colleges from the student's FAFSA, but they can select and compare costs for any school in Massachusetts. These data derive from Peterson's and can be adjusted by the institutions.



Expected Family Contribution (EFC)


The next section displays the student's EFC as calculated from their FAFSA. If a FAFSA is modified and resubmitted, the change will be reflected here within 72 hours.






Federal Financial Aid Opportunities

The next section displays the student's estimated full-time Pell Grant award. Clicking the name of the program takes the student to the Federal Student Aid website with further information about eligibility requirements.



State Financial Aid Opportunities

The last section gives information on the student's potential eligibility for up to 11 different state aid programs based on the college they select (eligibility depends on many factors, including citizenship status, whether the student seeks to attend a public or private institution, etc.).




State Financial Aid Opportunities (Continued)

Clicking the name of a program takes the student to the OSFA webpage with further information about eligibility requirements about that particular program. Students may find themselves potentially eligible for aid they weren't expecting!

Updating Eligibility


Sometimes OSFA needs more information from the student to make a determination. Clicking "update your eligibility here" displays a set of questions that could change a student's potential eligibility for aid. These questions are optional and can be changed at any time by the student.

- The Cost of Attendance information shown for Massachusetts colleges is provided by the institutions. If costs aren't shown or you're not sure about the full cost of attendance at an institution, contact the institution directly.
 - Cost of Attendance data will be updated each year in September, although the institutions have the ability to update this information at any time.
 - Only data for Massachusetts colleges are provided. Students interested in attending an out-ofstate institution should visit the website of that institution to learn more.
- This tool gives an indication of a student's potential eligibility for different forms of state and federal aid, subject to additional verification, and is not a guarantee.
 - Students should contact OSFA or the institution to learn more about their eligibility.
 - Remember that eligibility is based on a number of factors, including citizenship status, the type
 of institution they want to attend, and whether they seek to enroll full-time, half-time, or less
 than half-time, among other factors.
