

Common App Direct Admissions overview

MISSION

Common App is a nonprofit membership organization committed to the pursuit of access, equity, and integrity in the college admission process.

VISION

Be the trusted source to access, afford, and attain opportunity for all.

MOONSHOT

By 2030, Common App will close its equity gap in students pursuing post-secondary opportunities



Common App provides an online application that makes applying to college easy.

Each year, more than one million students — a third of whom are first-generation — explore and apply to over 1,000 member colleges and universities worldwide.



Common App Direct Admissions

Common App Direct Admissions simplifies college admission by extending offers to qualified first-generation and low- and middle-income students before they apply. Offers are based on information — like GPA — that students have entered into their Common App.

There's no application fee, and many colleges offer extra perks to make the process even easier, **like guaranteed financial aid and no personal essay or recommendations required.**

- 1. **Expand** the # of participating colleges
- 2. Streamline the student experience

2020-2023 (Pilots 1-3)

- 3–13 participating colleges
- 3.3k–33k students
- Manual email campaign for student notification

2023-2024

- 71 colleges / 1 state (CT)
- More than 1.3 million offers extended to more than 400k students
- 3.06 offers per student
- Automated email campaign
- Manual fee waiver process

2024-2025

- 117 colleges / 1 state (CT)
- In-app notifications and automated email campaign
- Automated fee waiver
- Additional "perks" for students


Direct Admissionsoffers

- Offers extended regularly throughout the cycle
- Application fees automatically waived
- View, learn, and act on offers in Common App
- In-app and email notifications
- All offers are conditional, pending confirmation of submitted application


Getting started

To receive a direct admissions offer, students must answer questions related to eligibility criteria:

- Create a Common App account
- Indicate their U.S. permanent residence
- Enter their GPA
- Respond to the Common App fee waiver question
- Provide highest education level of parent(s)



Students are notified of offers in the application and by email

Accepting direct admissions offers

To accept a direct admissions offer, students must submit their Common App to the college.

Before sending students a formal admission offer, colleges will verify the student meets their admission criteria through a review of supporting documents (e.g. transcript).

Accepting an offer and applying does not mean that a student must enroll.

Rescinding conditions

Music and Art majors must meet portfolio or audition requirements for admission to those programs.

Students applying to any majors within our Francis College of Engineering or Kennedy College of Sciences must have a B- (or it's equivalent) in Pre-Calculus or Calculus to be admitted to those

Students who do not meet the requirements for their selected major will automatically be considered for an alternate program.

Meet English proficiency requirements.

Demonstrate successful performance through their most recent transcript.

Meet high school minimum GPA according to the <u>Massachusetts Board</u> of High Education standards.
